a. Describe the impact of events leading up to American involvement in World War II; include Lend-Lease and the bombing of Pearl Harbor.

Lend-Lease Act	Roosevelt hoped to help the Allies (mainly Britain) without going to war. U.S.gave \$50 billion dollars of ammunition, tanks, airplanes, and food
Pearl Harbor, Hawaii	1. Japan invaded China, Indochina, and Thailand 2. U.S. froze their assets in US banks and refused to sell them oil and scrap metal 3. Japan attacked Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941

b. Evaluate the importance of Bell Aircraft, military bases, the Savannah and Brunswick shipyards, Richard Russell, and Carl Vinson.

Bell Aircraft	Built B-29 bombers in Marietta increasing the size of the city and the economy
Military Bases	Georgia again was home to many bases because of its climate: in South Georgia Moody Field in Valdosta; Waycross Army Air Base; Glynnco in Brunswick; Spenceville in Moultrie; Turner in Albany; Waycross
Savannah and Brunswick Shipyards	Hired many women to work in hard hat jobs building Liberty Ships
Richard Russell	One term governor;seven term senator; Chairman of the senate Armed Services Committee helped to bring bases to Georgia
Carl Vinson	On the Armed Service Committee in the House; he also helped to bring installations to GA. He helped to fund aircraft carriers

c. Explain the impact of the Holocaust on Georgians. **Georgia Commission on the Holocaust helps to teach the facts about the Holocaust and keep the memory of the travesty.**

d. Discuss the ties to Georgia that President Roosevelt had and his impact on the state.

1. Used Warm Springs for therapy for his polio.
2. Built the Little White House at Warm Springs.
3. National Youth Administration helped minorities to finish their education.
4. He died at Warm Springs April 12, 1945.
